What is Title I?

Title I is a K-12 program that provides additional academic support and learning opportunities for students at schools with high percentages of socioeconomically disadvantaged children.



- Two Types of Title I Programs

Targeted Assistance Program-Services to the students identified as having the greatest academic need.

Schoolwide Program-Comprehensive program to upgrade the entire educational program as a means to bolster the achievement levels of students having the greatest need.

Allocation of Funds

,Funds are supplemental.

Funds must be used for activities that are "necessary and reasonable" to implement the schoolwide plan and meet legislative intents and purposes.

Comprehensive needs assessment identifies the activities that are necessary and reasonable.

Schoolwide plan documents the activities that are necessary and reasonable.

Goals of Title I

- 1. Increase academic achievement.
- 2. Provide direct instructional support to students.
- 3. Provide professional development teachers.
- 4. Promote parent education and involvement.



How to Qualify?

Schoolwide programs provide supplemental funds to upgrade instruction in a Title I school, without identifying "eligible" or "ineligible" students. It is critical to address the needs of all children in the school, but particularly the needs of low-achieving students and those at risk of not meeting the New Jersey Student Learning Standards.

Services Provided

Academic Interventionist (reading or math specialist) to help students at greatest risk of failing.

- Diagnostic and interactive educational programs to provide additional support to students in the classroom: i-Ready and MobyMax.
 - Parent Liaison/ School Counselor Staff Professional Development
 - Computers
 - Parent University Summer Enrichment Saturday Academy


